

What is it they say about March--in like a lamb, out like a lion? March 2024 roared all month long. It began with prep for our first council meeting of 2024—we elected officers: **President: Tom Accola; VP – Gabriele DiTota; Secretary--Dale McKeny** and once again affirmed **Fay Schill for Treasurer**. We welcomed **Leslie Leazer** to council. I also signed our lease with Lifeline Academy. I then had the great pleasure of joining a group of old friends, mostly veterans like me, including my youngest son, Paul, on a fantastic fishing trip to Guatemala. Here are some highlights of this incredible experience:

Landing at/leaving the La Aurora airport on a minibus, we pass through crowded streets, transitioning from the city's high mountain plain down a steep, twisting pass, eventually passing by banana tree farms, sugar cane fields, and 4 active volcanoes: Fuego, Pacaya, Agua, and Acatenango. After several hours, we arrived at the bustling Pacific coast town of Puerto San Jose. Life is right there before you on the dusty streets: makeshift grills and ovens; clothing and other mer-chandise displays, open air churches, fruit stands, 4-member families piled onto motorbikes. We were welcomed at our fishing lodge—there are several in the area—by friendly local staff who simply can't do enough to keep you well-fed and comfortable.

Lots of quiet time on the open sea as we sailed from the local marina daily for the two-hour, 30 mile boat ride to the prime fishing areas. Quiet time to marvel at God's creation—it's vastness, diversity, beauty and magnificence. A seagull poses on the back of a large turtle. Schools of spinner dolphin doing just that—spinning as they jumped from the sea surface, putting on a spectacular show for us. Flying fish escorting our boat airborne for 30 seconds per flight. Manta rays rising and somersaulting before diving back into the water. Catch & release encounters with sailfish—those magnificent creatures of the sea—and pulling in colorful dolphin—the eating kind, not Flipper--they call them dorado or mahi mahi in Guatemala, and dining on them for lunch and dinner. Returning from Guatemala to welcome Daylight Savings Time and the first day of spring: March 20. Our Lenten Wednesday soup/sandwich gatherings and Sunday school prior to Sunday services have been great blessings. Holy Week, Good Friday, and Easter/Resurrection Day closed out the month.

God continues to love us individually and favor our church mightily! How do we grow our ability to spread His word and share these blessings with others?

Blessed Easter to all members, visitors, and friends of Peace Lutheran Church.

As you can see below, financially we had an excellent month due to two members giving their <u>yearly tithe</u>. We are also under budget in our expenses for the year. Yeah! Our thanks to all who contribute and give with a joyful heart. God bless you. This amount brings the General Fund into the black and gives us a cushion when it's time to pay the property and liability insurance at the end of May.

Please consider giving an <u>extra offering (weekly or monthly) (on the same check as your tithe)</u> to the Major Repair Fund for the roof replacement. Just mark it "Roof Repairs" and the extra amount you wish to give. You will soon see a thermometer (by popular demand) in the narthex showing what is needed for a new roof.

Leslie Leazer has volunteered to take over the treasurer's job. We have started training, and she has my deepest gratitude.

We have a signed lease with Lifeline Academy beginning in March and going through August of 2027. This will help tremendously with finances for the church. They will be using the Education Building exclusively and the Fellowship Hall M-F 7 – 4. In August you will see children and young people on the church campus along with our regular groups (Meals on Wheels, Brown Bag Brunch, CODA, and In-Season Ministries) using the campus.

The Building Maintenance Fund stands at \$14,074.95 for new Air Conditioners and other projects. We did replace an AC in the Education Building in February, which will be paid for in March

Did you know? Instead of writing multiple checks for individual contributions like the Children's Hunger Project, the Food Pantry, etc., you only have to write one check. Simply designate the breakdown of your giving in the check's memo area or on the envelope itself. "FP" for Food Pantry, "CHP" for Children's Hunger Project, and so on.
